

- The major discoveries of natural gas by Statoil, Ophir Energy and BG Group. Official discovered in 2012
- Total estimated natural gas reserves quadrupled from 10 trillion to 40 trillion cubic feet. Offshore gas fields at Songo Songo and Mnazi Bay are currently in the process of being developed by Pan African Energy and Maurel and Prom in conjunction with the Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC).
- Expected to be one stop Centre of investment for oil and gas economy in east Africa.



#### **Cashew nut Processing:**

120, 000 tones annually. Only about 10% of the cashew nuts produced within the country is processed.

#### **Textile and apparel**

More than 80% in raw and only 20% is locally processed.

#### **Leather Sector**

livestock population (17.7m cattle, 12.5m goats and 3.5m sheep) and produces about 2.6 million pieces of raw hides and skins annually. Only 10% is processed within Tanzania.

#### **Renewable Energy**

Energy is recognized as key challenge for Tanzania's sustainable development

# Infrastructure challenge and development

#### **Achievements**

- The government has made infrastructures part of its strategic pillar to help in supporting development
- Tanzania's power sector is characterized by improvements each day.
- What drives East Africa growth and improvements in infrastructure is the discovery of oil and gas.

#### Challenge

- poor performance and weak financial condition represents Tanzania's most serious infrastructure challenge
- Inadequate maintenance to existing infrastructure

# Infrastructure challenge and development

- Infrastructure could contribute much more to Tanzania's growth performance than it has in the recent past. Tanzania's annual economic growth averaged 7.0 percent from 2003-2007, compared with 3.7 percent from 1990 to 2002.
- The water supply sector shows poor performance and declining coverage despite the sector reforms and an increase in financing. Access to clean and safe water in Tanzania has fallen significantly since 2000 in both urban and rural areas.
- Annual infrastructure spending of US\$ 2.9 billion is needed to catch up on infrastructure; that cost, relative to GDP, is comparable to that incurred by China in recent years.
- Tanzania would need to invest US\$ 2.9 billion annually for a decade to catch up with the rest of the developing world in terms of infrastructure.

## Mining Sector

#### **Mining Overview**

- Tanzania is Africa fourth largest producer of gold and diamond.
- Forecast to grow at 1.6 from 0.9 to reach \$1.0bn by 2018
- Tanzania has substantial long term potential of coal production
- Gemstones have little attention in Tanzania compared to precious metals
- Small scale Mining encounter with many challenge


Tanzania is among the countries having abundant mineral resources.

The data base indicates that the minerals found in Tanzania are grouped into the following major categories:


- Metallic Minerals, which include gold, iron ore, nickel, copper, cobalt and silver.
- Gemstones, which include diamonds, tanzanite, ruby, garnets, pearl etc
- Industrial Minerals, which include limestone, soda ash, gypsum, salt and phosphates;
- Energy source Minerals, such as coal and uranium; and.
- Construction minerals, such as aggregates, gravel, sand and dimension stones.

(Country's Wallet of Minerals)


